Sacrament of Baptism of Infants: Please call the Rectory Office for information to schedule any baptism. Interested in becoming Catholic? Please contact the Parish Office to begin preparation for receiving the Sacraments of initiation. **Sacrament of Matrimony:** Make the arrangement with the Parish Office at least nine months prior to celebration of your wedding.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick:

Request the Anointing of the Sick when you know the date of an upcoming medical procedure or the beginning of the medical treatment by calling the Parish Office. The peace that the Sacrament offers can be yours during the days you prepare for the medical appointment.

Ministry of Caring – Communion to the Sick, Hospital, and Shut-In Visits:

If you have a family member who needs Holy Communion taken to them on the weekend after a particular Mass, please call the Parish Office during the regular Office Hours, so we can arrange for trained Extraordinary Minister of the Holy Communion to visit. **Also, please notify the Parish Office if you know someone at home or in the hospital.** The hospitals do not notify the rectory of hospital stays, so please have a family member call the rectory. Anyone who needs to be included on the First Fridays' Visitation list of the Sick, please call the Parish Office. Father Michael Wolfe will try to visit them each month during the day of the First Friday of the month.

Marian Devotions:

Approximately 30 minutes before each Mass begins with the recitation of the Holy Rosary. Assistance from our Parish Office

Sponsor Certificates: If you are asked to be a Baptism or Confirmation sponsor, our parish secretary can help you with the required certificate. Please call the Parish Office at least one month prior to the celebration of the Sacrament. This presumes that you are a registered member of Queen of Archangels parish and practicing Catholic living a valid Church Marriage (if married).

Liturgical Reflections...

For several centuries, the traditional Forty Hours Devotion has been celebrated in parishes as a time of renewal and prayer. In the early 1500s at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Milan, Italy, Forty Hours Devotion began probably as a commemoration of the forty hours that Christ's body lay in the tomb between his death and resurrection. By the 1700s the form of the devotion was codified for the churches of Rome. Forty Hours Devotion was first approved for the diocese of Baltimore in 1857 and extended to all the dioceses of the United States in 1868. The Second Vatican Council encouraged the practice of solemn annual exposition in every parish.
